The President of the United States.

To the Marshal of the Western District of Arkansas—Greeting:

WHEREAS, at the District Court of the United States of America, for the Western District of Arkansas, at the May Term thereof, begun and holden in the city of Fort Smith, within and for the District aforesaid, on the 25th day of May A. D. 1871, the Grand Jurors, in and for said District empaneled, brought into the said Court a true Bill of Indictment against Wyatt Earp and John Shown for having Larceny in the Indian Country

against the peace and dignity of the United States. As by the said Indictment, now remaining on file and of record in said Court, will more fully appear; to which indictment said Wyatt Earp and John Shown has not yet appeared or pleaded.

Now, Therefore, You are hereby commanded, in the name of the President of the United States of America, to apprehend said Earp and Shown and him to detain and bring before the said Court at the United States Court Room in the city of Fort Smith, in said District, at the November Term thereof, to be held on the 15th day of November A. D. 1871, to answer said Indictment.
